1. *Of those students who transferred in to UW from WY CC's in fall 2013 who did NOT have an Associate's Degree, what was the average number elective credit hours at the time of transfer and total number of credits by sending institution and receiving college?*

Students without Associate's Degrees:

- Transfer in an average of 51 credits
- Of these, there are 15 elective credit hours
 - What is the range of average elective hours?
 - By academic area, 9 to 22 hours
 - By WY CC, 12 to 18 hours

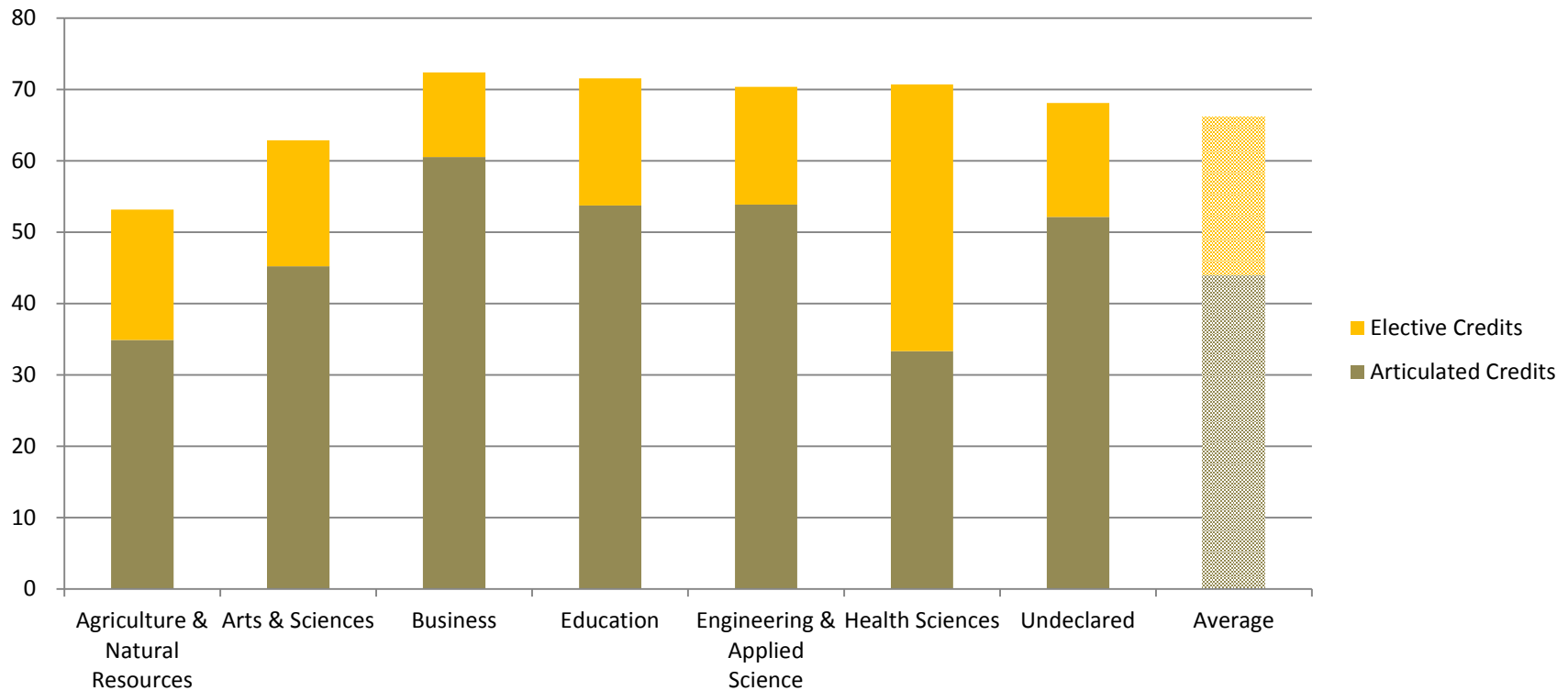


Students with AA/AS Degrees:

- Transfer in an average of 66 credits
 - Four academic areas (UW colleges) average 70+
- Of these, there are 22 elective credit hours
 - What is the range of credit hours?
 - By academic area, 12 to 37 hours
 - By WY CC, 14 to 25 hours

2. Of those students who graduated from UW in the 2012-13 academic year who transferred from a WY CC, what was the average number of credit hours on graduation (both transfer and UW hours) and how does that compare with the non-transfer population who graduated the same academic year, by sending institution and receiving college?



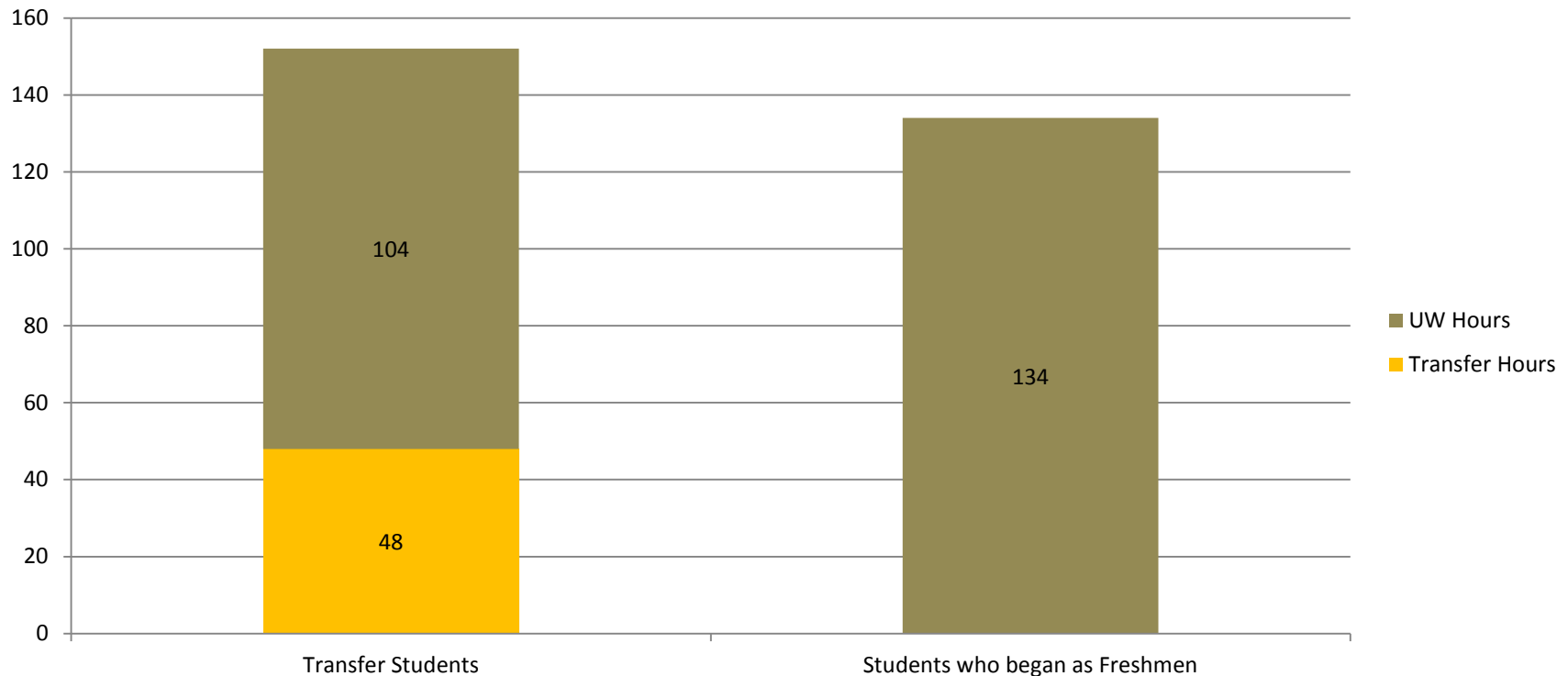
UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING

At the time of UW graduation:

- Wyoming community college transfers averaged 18 more hours than non-transfers
 - Average hours at graduation for students who started as freshman at UW is **134**
 - Average hours for WY CC transfers- with *and* without an AA/AS degree is **152**
 - For those with AA/AS degrees, the credit hour range at graduation is **155-166**
