In accordance with Wyoming Statute 19-14-16, the community college commission shall promulgate rules for the implementation of the free tuition pursuant to subsections (f) through (k) of this section.

Based on your office issuing the rules, the Wyoming Veterans Commission would like to offer a list of Expedition Medals that should be considered under this program.

The following U.S. Army Badges indicate combat service and could be used to suggest eligibility. Though they are <u>not expeditionary medals</u>, they do indicate combat service, which is typically overseas. It would be assumed that a Soldier earning one of these badges would also be eligible for an expeditionary medal.

Combat Infantryman's Badge (first through fourth award) Combat Action Badge (first through fourth award) Combat Medical Badge (first through fourth award) Combat Parachutist Badge (one through five jumps)
