Successful completion of the 2+2 plan requires that a student remain continuously enrolled and graduate with the associate's degree from his or her respective community college. • This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

Laramie County Community College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, 15 of which must be from Laramie County Community College, with a grade point average of 2.0 or better at course level of 1000 or higher (ENGL 1001 does not apply).

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.

UW College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

LCCC Program Notes:

- 1- This course has at least one prerequisite. Check the course descriptions section of the catalog to see the course prerequisites.
- 2- Depending on math and writing placement scores (consult with advisor on placement before developing program schedule), students may need to complete the appropriate developmental course(s) before enrolling in these classes. This may increase the total number of program credits.
- 3- PHIL 1000, HUMN 1010, and HUMN 1020 will satisfy the general education cultural awareness requirement; however, note that those seeking an A.A. in English must complete all three at some point in their course sequence.
- 4- Students may take any 2000-level ENGL course to meet this requirement, but students who plan to transfer to another institution after LCCC need to consult with an advisor before choosing which class(es) to take.
- 5- Choose from ART, CO/M, HUMN, MMMM, MUSC, PHIL, POLS, PSYC, SOC, THEA or Third Semester World Language Course

UW Program Notes:

6- Historical Period: Take 4 of these 5. Transfer students may also apply up to 6 hours of English survey courses (ENGL 2425, 2430, 2435 or equivalent) for credit in historical period courses.

2- English Electives: Students can choose any English courses for credit in this category. One of the 3 must be in either Rhetoric & Composition or Creative Writing.

8- Expanding the Canon: Course options vary by semester, but may include American Indian literature, Mexican American literature, African American literature, postcolonial literature, feminist theory, disability studies, and queer theory. Consult with an advisor.

- At least 21 of the 36 credit hours in the major must be upper division.
