

Kaplan Nursing Entrance Exam

In order to apply to the LCCC nursing program, you must successfully complete the Kaplan Nursing Entrance Exam. You will need a minimum overall score of 70 and a reading score of 73 on the same test. There is a three-week waiting period between tests. You can take no more than two tests in a twelve month period. If unsuccessful, there is a one-year waiting period from the date of the last test taken. Score valid for three years.

EXAM REGISTRATION

- By appointment only
- Photo ID (driver's license, LCCC student ID, military ID, passport, etc.)

EXAM DETAILS

- 91 multiple-choice questions. Computerized with immediate scoring.
- 4 subject areas: reading, math, science, and English
- Answers left blank will be counted incorrect, so make a guess.
- Scratch paper, pencil, and calculator provided

EXAM CONTENTS

MATH—Multiplication, addition, subtraction, and division of whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percentages, ratios/proportions. Conversion of fractions to decimals, percentages to fractions, etc. Word problems.

SCIENCE—Physiology systems: cardiovascular, fluid & electrolytes, gastrointestinal, hematological, immune, renal, respiratory, and sensory. Homeostasis and neurology included.

ENGLISH—Punctuation, grammar, sentence structure, paragraph logic, and passage development.

READING—Paragraph comprehension, passage comprehension, and inferences/conclusions

STUDY MATERIALS

- No specific review guide recommended. Check the Internet, LCCC library, or bookstores for a review guide. A guide that prepares you to take any nurse entrance test will provide an overview of the basic skills covered on the Kaplan test. Please note only physiology systems are covered in science.
