The Freedom Seat: Women in Aviation

Let's talk Aviation and Women: The history of female pilots from 1907 up to the present day. Women of all nationalities were "Early Birds" – earning their licenses before 1916, and continued to fly after WWI. During WWII the ATA of England and WASP of the USA ferried aircraft.
