## 1.0 POLICY & PURPOSE

The Board of Trustees of Laramie County Community College (LCCC) believes it is their responsibility to create, nurture, and promote a safe environment of healthy life-long behaviors and enhance academic and personal success.

The Board also believes in establishing guidelines and regulations governing the utilization, storage, and reporting of opioid antagonists, by trained personnel within LCCC. Designated staff of LCCC, as well as those who choose to, should be trained in the proper use and reporting of opioid antagonists, (i.e., Naloxone Hydrochloride or Narcan) in accordance with <a href="Wyoming State Statutes 35-4-903 through 35-4-906">Wyoming State Statutes 35-4-903 through 35-4-906</a>. The College has a primary concern for the health and safety of its students, staff and visitors. Any person acting in good faith, trained or untrained, may administer epinephrine through use of an epinephrine auto-injector or an opiate antagonist to another person who appears to be experiencing anaphylaxis or an opiate related drug overdose.

Therefore, the Board directs the President to implement Administrative Procedures governing the acquisition, administration, and storage of opiate antagonists, and administration devices or kits for emergency use to assist a student, staff member, or other individual believed to or suspected to be experiencing an opioid overdose on campus property.
