- I. Call to order (2:09 p.m.)
- II. Roll Call- Quorum met
 - a. Absent: Senator Tillman
- III. Public Input- None
- IV. Executive Reports
 - a. President- No Report
 - b. Acting President and Vice President
 - i. Brought SGA concerns to President Schaffer such as:
 - Icy Roads and parking lots
